4	Point It is estimated that 35 percent of women worldwide have experienced either physical and/or sexual intimate partner violence or sexual violence by a non-partner (not including sexual harassment) at some point in their lives. Challenge However, some studies show that up to 70 percent of women have experienced physical and/or sexual violence from an intimate partner in their lifetime. Point More than four out of every five trafficked women and nearly three out of every four trafficked girls are trafficked for the purpose of sexual exploitation. Challenge All trafficked girls are for sexual exploitation. Point Still, 12 million girls under 18 are married each year and in sub-Saharan Africa—where this harmful practice is most common—almost four out of 10 young women were married before their 18 th birthday. Challenge Co-habitation is on the rise leading to the same problems among teenage girls. Point School-related gender-based violence which is ingrained in many boys' mentality is a major obstacle to universal schooling and the right to education for girls. Challenge	

Some schools are encouraging positive discrimination with the hope that in the long run gender-based violence in schools will be solved.

- Sexual intimate partner violence and abuse is not about to decrease in the foreseeable future.
 - Domestic violence influences young boys to use violence later.
 - Failed relationships can give rise to crime.
 - Most human trafficking victims are women and girls.
 - Child marriage still affects plenty of women today.
 - The practice of female genital mutilations is expanding due to migration.
 - Forced sex is not often denounced.
